As our **Dominican Republic** Mission trip draws closer, the excitement is building. Already, we are seeing great things happening around us. ## **Training Sessions**

We will be reviewing and discussing the trip at each of our training meetings scheduled monthly. It is imperative that each student and parent/guardian is able to do all 3 sessions of training to allow them to feel prepared and be comfortable while working at the mission. Parents not traveling with us are always welcome to attend as well. Other gatherings may be called as needed.

# **Fundraisers**

Fundraising is a necessary part of our mission preparation. We need to do fundraisers to offset the cost of our mission activities and to be able to assist our ministry partners. This year we are planning a variety of events to help offset some of the costs associated with the mission needs and keep the cost to students and families as low as realistically possible. This also gives our church families, families connections, friends, etc the opportunity to participate in this mission effort along with us. Parents will be needed to assist. Those planning to serve in the **DR** will be required to commit to being an active part of the fundraising efforts.

### **Prayer**

Prayer is an enormous part of any Mission trip. We ask that you continue to pray for each leader and each student going on the trip, and the people we will be serving with in **DR**.

Each student will be asked to identify and connect with an adult prayer partner who will commit to pray for them in the months leading up to the Mission, while in country, and in the weeks following. The student will need to communicate their prayer partner's email address to the Coordinators so that they can be kept in the loop.

# Mission 2024

## When do you go on the mission?

January 5th - January 12th, 2024 are our anticipated dates. These may be required to be shifted by a day or two either way to accommodate available flights and airport travel arrangements.

### Where do we serve?

We will be serving in and around the area of Caberette, Dominican Republic.

# What's included in the registration fee?

We want your trip to be as easy on you as possible. That's why we provide the following so you don't have to:

- Lodging during the week
- · All meals, except travel meals and snacks
- Pre-trip training to prepare before we do our mission
- Experienced mission-minded leaders
- Fundraising ideas and support

# Who can participate?

High School Students and young adults along with one parent, grandparent, or trusted adult in their life.

### How many adults are attending?

Adults (age 20 and above) are a critical part of the experience because they help provide safety, relationships, spiritual guidance, and discipline. We are seeking to bring one adult for each family represented. One of the unique aspects of this trip is the attempt to partner teens in service with members of their family or trusted adults in their lives. Additionally we have other adults serving in country during the same time period.

# What about transportation?

We will be arranging transportation for our group to the airport from within the people represented. Some families may be asked to drive as they are able. During the week we use local transportation in country.

# Where do we stay?

Lodging is provided at a secure all inclusive resort that serves 'americanized' food. Rooms will be organized on a case by case basis. There is a common eating area, and shared program area.

# What does your typical day look like?

There will be a team meeting each morning to go over the service opportunities for the day which may include:

Renovations

Community Outreach

# When do I have to pay?

Fundraising takes time, and sometimes more than one effort, so we've broken your trip into 4 payments to cover the \$750 cost (with Fundraising efforts – total trip cost is roughly \$1800/participant):

### PAYMENT #1

- A non-refundable deposit of \$150.00 is required no later than the end of JUNE 2023

- \$200 Due at September Meeting PAYMENT #3 OCTOBER 29th, 2023
- 50% of your remaining balance is due (\$200) PAYMENT #4 NOVEMBER 26th, 2023

# Mission Trip Packing List – 2024

Packing for a mission trip requires a lot of careful planning to make the trip a success. This is a sample packing list for your convenience. A MORE DETAILED AND EXHAUSTIVE LIST WILL BE PROVIDED AT A TRAINING MEETING. This is international airline travel so please, when the FINAL LIST is provided stick to it as close as possible. The FINAL LIST will include baggage weight limits that MUST BE ADHERED TO. We have also included a section of what NOT to bring...just in case you were wondering.

□ Your Bible, pen and paper
□ A week's worth of shirts, pants and undergarments. Be sure that your shirts and pants are varied for both cooler and warmer days. (appropriate attire will be discussed at training meetings)
□ A week's worth of socks
□ 1 sweatshirt/hoodie
$\hfill \square$ 1 pair of sneakers or walking shoes (you will be doing a lot of walking and running) and flip flops or sandals
□ 1 pair of rugged shoes (boots, etc)
□ Jacket/coat/ rain coat, hat
□ Hairbrush
□ Toothbrush & toothpaste
□ Deodorant
□ Sleepwear
□ Any medications you require (in original packaging)
□ Any additional personal hygiene products you require
□ A waist pack or back pack for camera and personal items (This will serve as your carry on)
□ A modest bathing suit for swimming (at the resort) or bathing
□ Passport & Proof of travel insurance (this can be kept by leaders while in country for safety and reissued when necessary if desired)
□ Spending money:

- Money should be used for 2 travel meals, snack food and any personal souvenirs.
- \$100.00 US funds is the minimum recommended
- Leaders will not be responsible for students spending habits

# Mission Trip Packing List – 2024

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### Reminders:

- Clothes should be modest and worn that way.
- No bottom of shirts tied up to expose the waist.
- Don't bring clothes that give you that "poured in" or "painted on" look. No skinny jeans.
- Jeans must be at the waist with no undergarments showing
- Girls must wear bras. The midriff should not show when bending over or raising your arms.
   When either standing or bending, you must have a modest top.
- No skirts or dresses above the knee slits cannot go above the knee.
